BIO-AESTHETIC PLANNING'

Bio-aesthetic planning' defined by Prof. Lancelot Hogben, as 'conscious plan of the flora (plants) and fauna (animals) with the objective of beautifying the country.' It includes the planting of ornamental flowering trees along the city roads, in parks, public places, and compound & houses both in towns & villages. It also includes the development of 'nature parks' for the preservation of beautiful non-carnivorous animals & the creation of bird sanctuaries.

For example, Butterfly gardening can be a part of bio-aesthetic planning that focuses on the preservation of different species of butterflies as well as landscaping too. Butterflies are the most attractive insects and they give added interest to gardens when they visit flowers to feed on nectar. Creating a butterfly garden not only attracts beautiful butterflies but also filled the garden with colorful flowers throughout spring, summer, and fall. It focuses on creating a landscape with different ornamental plants that will provide a suitable environment for butterflies to thrive and reproduce.
